

About Alice Salomon University of Applied Science



The Alice Salomon University of Applied Sciences, Berlin, looks back over a long tradition:

- 2008 it celebrated the 100th birthday
- The history of ASH is closely linked with both the development of social work and the life and work of Alice Salomon
- In 1908 Alice Salomon (1872–1948) founded the “Social School for Women” (whose two-year program became a model for the establishment of other schools and greatly influenced the development of social work in Germany)
- With the start of the Nazi dictatorship, the Social School for Women dismissed Jewish members and abandoned its emancipatory orientation and focus on social justice
- Alice Salomon was expelled from Germany in 1937
- After liberation from the Nazi dictatorship, the school was able to take up its work once again in June of 1945 (drawing on its training program from the 1920s and looking to democratic American models for guidance)

The University of Applied Sciences has borne the name of Alice Salomon since 1991.

Target Audience

Where you are from or how old you are does not matter. However, please note that we do not offer funding and that the curriculum of the Summer School is primarily structured for participants currently pursuing undergraduate studies.

Therefore the main target group are undergraduate social work students (or students in similar fields).

Number of Participants

This year's program will admit between 20 and 40 participants.

Certificate and ECTS Credits

Every participant will receive 5 ECTS credits for taking part in this year's International Summer School. In order to receive the Certificate of Attendance this year, students are required to write a 1.500 – 2.000 word paper discussing the main headline. Please find the guidelines for your controversy paper online. The paper should be submitted in advance and fulfill the standards of academic writing. An English level B2 (Common European Framework of Reference for Languages) is recommended.

Course Fees and Visa

Course Fees are 300 Euro

Accommodation, free coffee, tea and table water during the workshops, sight seeing, welcome and farewell party, field visits, as well as highly professional workshop-leaders are included.

Concerning Accommodation

The fees for the International Summer School 2016 at ASH include an accommodation-fee. All participants will stay with students from ASH in order to support an exchange with locals.
