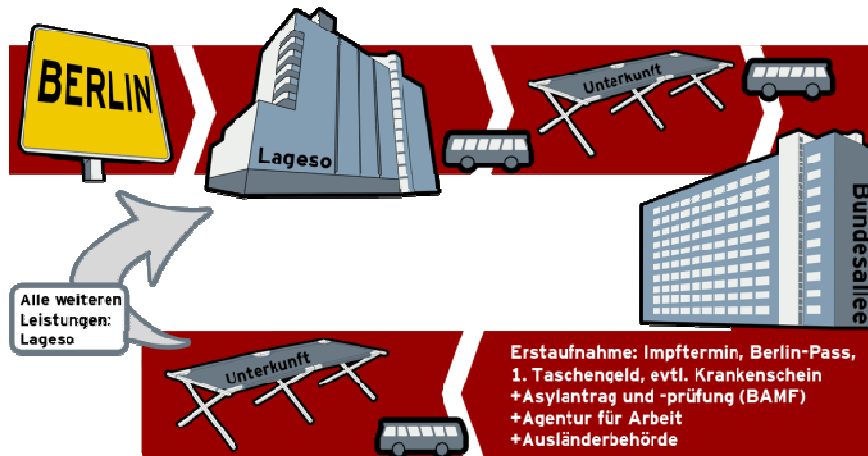

Termination of the Workshop „Inclusion into the labor market“, 7-7-2016



Part I (10-13 o'clock)

10:00 a.m:

We start with an icebreaker named "truth or lie" (approx. 15 min) with the aim to know our names and common interests of the group at the end.

A few introductory words about the situation of the refugees on the labor market in Germany at the moment follow and we also give an overall view of the day and to the following action (approx. 20 min).

Therefore we invite a fled as expert who can report about his personal experiences as well as could accompany / train the following play. (noch keine Zusage)

Approx. 10:45 a.m. :

We plan a role play. Each person have to take part. We work in small groups (approx. 5 people) who present situations which happen here in Germany e.g. in the job centre or the Regional Office for Health and Social Affairs Berlin (LAGeSo).

The LARP (Live action Role Playing) is an element of the experience educational theory. The participants should be able to feel here exemplarily the feeling of exclusion and helplessness in the situation through the active experience. On the emotional level so realistic problems and obstacles are obtained during inclusion into the job market.

- Preparation: The different characters (e.g. a specialist, two refugees) of a small group are written on cards and pulled by the participants before. Then the made (problematic) situation / the assigned role is played by each group. (1 group approx. 15-20 min)



short break (11:15-11:45)

Approx. 11:45 a.m. :

Continuation of the presentation of the role plays with mixed compositions of the groups / characters

Approx. 1:30 p.m. :

Time for questions, reflexion, feedback and disscussion. Arisen questions from the first part can be held on here (flipchart), own views / experiences are expressed.



Long break (13-14 o'clock)

Part II (14-17 o'clock):

2:00 p.m.:

A talk is planned by staff member of the migration advice. Concerning the contents the momentary situation of the fled and the concrete problem fields in the practice (concerning the job market, with authorities or the employers) should be discussed. Solution attempts / ideas from the point of the migration advice and the interface the tension field to the occupation of the social worker should become a subject. Open questions from the first part of the event also should be answered by the experts. Perhaps we write down the compiled solutions and concrete proposals.



Short break (15:15-15:45)

approx. 4:00 p.m.:

At the end of the event there should be a feedback session (with flipchart), enough discussion time and at the end discharging the group about 5:00 p.m.

Maybe inform the group about the outlook of tomorrow.

Workshop 2. - Wednesday, 08.07.2016

Housing and living situation of refugees in Berlin and Germany

The Topic of the day is going to be 'inclusion of refugees into housing'. You will get to know different aspects that concern the subject of living and housing. After a short welcome and introduction first there will be given an overview on the legal situation including minimum standards of shelters. That for we invited Volker Gerloff a lawyer for social law. Then you will be working in groups on different topics. Afterwards information will be shared by summarized poster presentations.

After the lunch-break we will focus on the demands of people who have to live in refugee shelters and mass accommodations. Also we would like to introduce the students initiative Grenzen_weg (Alice Salomon Hochschule Berlin), which has different projects that focus on asylum and racism. It should give an example how students can participate critically and get active in showing solidarity with refugees. We will close the day with a world café.



The aim of the day is get to know the circumstances of housing for refugees in the three aspects:

legal situation and rights – experienced living conditions – refugee struggles against these conditions.

Workshop 3. – Monday, 11.07.2016

Concept and program for the 11th of July 2016

Topic of the day: Social Inclusion through cultural Education

„ Social Inclusion through cultural education - what does it mean in practice? “

We would like to explore with you how social inclusion through cultural education could work by experiencing different methods together.

After a little warm up game, we have the honour to get a theoretical input into the field of work through the expert Bahare Sharifi. She studied literature, theatre and sociology in London and Hamburg and is curating Festivals at Maxim Gorki Theater in Berlin. Her focus is intercultural work and prejudice-conscious education.

Then you have the option to choose one out of four workshops to gain practical experiences. Afterwards, we would like to evaluate the workshops and the day with you and also put the experiences back in to the context of the summer school topic with the presence of experts.

We look forward to share a day full of encounters, joy and new experiences with all of you.

The participants should be prepared for an active day and be wearing comfortable clothes or sportswear.

Talk about social inclusion of refugees with experts (60min)

The four workshop options are:

Skating

This workshop will introduce the basic positions by showing and practicing. Skating workshops enable us to offer a non-verbal activity for refugees and heterogenic groups in which participants don't share the same language. We want to show the participants of the

international summer school that the experience of a new and joint activity creates the feeling of togetherness and the possibility to meet as equals.

Dancing

Dabke is a traditional oriental festive dance that literally means „stomp your feet on the ground“. You dance Dabke in a row and each dancer is creating physical contact to holding hands or touching each other's shoulders. This workshop is provided by people that seek refuge and we invite you to dance with us and enjoy ourselves.

Experiential/Outdoor Education

Experiential/outdoor education offers you to develop social skills, learn more about yourself and to extend your boundaries. This happens mainly through group experiences in nature followed by small reflections. In this workshop you will get a little insight into this holistic field of education through small group interactions and cooperative adventure games. Join in and have fun!

Acrobatics

To hold and get held. This workshop is about using your own body for game of balance with others. By utilizing technics of circus education there is a possibility to lift and carry each other physically. Instead of prior experience and physical strength, you'll get successful results by exploring capabilities under professional guidance. Simple exercise will bring us to basic figurines and human pyramids.

Workshop 4. - Tuesday, 12.07.2016

HEALTH

Morning:

The day will start around 10 am. First of all there will be a welcoming time for all the students. They will be introduced to the topic "health". The main act in the morning is the lecture of an expert for health issues. The expert will talk for one and a half hour Afterwards there is time to discuss the topic with all the students.

For the expert we reached out to Dr. Kim and other professionals from the University, so far we got no commitment. Although we contacted different experts in Berlin for the topic. The most important thing for our group is that we get an expert who can talk about the first steps for refugees when they arrive.

For the morning act it would be the best to get the audiomaxx, because of its size every student can join the speech.

At 1 pm lunch break

Afternoon:

In the Afternoon there will be three stations with different topics, but all connected to the topic of "health". In common stations will be introduced by one of the group members. Also we arranged a sit-in with refugees, which are in Berlin now. In that way the students can talk and ask questions and the person can tell their story. We try to get a professional from AOK that can inform the students of the first steps for getting health care. To lighten everything up we decided to make some sport breaks. There will be the chance to do Yoga units between the stations. For that we would need the gym of the ASH. Gianna Grünig is asked to guide the Yoga, dance or relaxing units.

2. Laloka – Community Center

Starts at 9:45 am – meeting in front of the Alice-Salomon entrance

At 10 am we are going to visit the community center "Laloka" which is supposed to be a meeting place for refugees who live in a asylum seekers home close by. There is a selforganized internetcafé and different other activities and counseling is held. It is an good example of how refugees have the possibility to organize themselves and how refugees and people from the surrounding neighborhood can get to know each other. There we will meet a person who works at the internetcafé to get more information about the structure and the facilities.

Afterwards, at around 12 we will be back at the Alice Salomon University to meet the person who is responsible for registering racist attacks in the district of Marzahn-Hellersdorf.

He will talk about his work and the racist climate of this district which refugees have to face here. Together with that, there will be a small exhibition which display the current situation.

3. “Malteser Refugee Hospital“

In Germany health insurance is mandatory for every inhabitant. However, many people still fall through the cracks: EU-citizens, undocumented migrants, homeless people, free lancers and elderly are among the patients of Malteser Migranten Medizin. The ambulance offers free basic health treatment for people without health insurance. You will talk to the social worker who is offering social consultation for this target group. The main focus of the

field trip is the legal frame work and the procedures for the traget group to achieve access to health care.
